

James Luther, chairman, called the regular monthly meeting of the White Township Board of Supervisors to order at 7:00 PM. The meeting began with the pledge of allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and the Lord's prayer. Those present included supervisors James Luther, Fred Soisson, and Tracy Plessinger, and Dave Campbell. Rick Gates arrived at 7:49.

The minutes of the July regular meeting were read. Fred Soisson made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Tracy Plessinger seconded the motion. A vote was taken. All three supervisors voted aye.

Visitors

Public/Supervisor Comment

Fred Soisson noted that the supervisors met with Lisa Helbig, EIT Collector, prior to tonight's meeting. Three issues were discussed. The need for timely payments to the township, timely refunds to citizens that are due them, and providing forms to businesses for quarterly payment of withheld taxes. The supervisors stressed that Ms. Helbig must improve on her past performance in these areas.

Old Business

The secretary reported that the CCSEA and CCBCEA are continuing to work to bring the Tom Ross property into compliance. The CCSEA has confirmed that the septic tank on the property has been crushed to render it unusable.

The secretary contacted four local contractors regarding the summer road project. Since the price was projected to less than \$10,000 a formal written bid process was not necessary. Tracy Plessinger made a motion to authorize the road master to award the contract based on price and ability to do the work in a timely manner. Fred Soisson seconded the motion. A vote was taken. All three supervisors voted aye.

The secretary updated the supervisors on the progress of the Glendale Valley News, a municipal newsletter sponsored by GIDA. The first issue is being completely underwritten by GIDA and will be mailed to every household in the five municipalities represented by GIDA. It will be mailed around September 1.

The secretary reminded the supervisors that the GIDA is holding their Annual Pig Roast on Tuesday, August 16, at Beachwood Park in Coalport.

The supervisors have received a copy of a letter from Mr. Randall Hurst, attorney for the Glendale Yearound Sewer Company. Mr. Hurst asked for several actions as a "show of good faith" on the part of White Township and the GVMA. After discussion, the supervisors agreed that the offer to enter negotiations for a purchase was our show of good faith and no other actions should be taken.

The secretary reported that our appeal of our Act 537 amendment rejection is proceeding. The Glendale Sewer Company had filed a motion to the appeal be dismissed on a technicality. That motion was rejected. The Glendale Yearound Sewer Company has also filed an objection to PaDEP and the township's proposal to join the appeal of the Act 537 amendment rejection and the NPDES permit appeal. That objection is pending.

New Business/Secretaries Report

The secretary reported that the GVMA is requesting both White and Reade Townships to pass the mandatory tap ordinances necessary to receive USDA Rural Development funding for the sewer and water projects. This will ensure that there will be no delays in the funding process. Tracy Plessinger made a motion to instruct our solicitor to prepare and advertise the necessary mandatory tap ordinance documents. Fred Soisson seconded the motion. A vote was taken. All three supervisors voted aye. Jim Luther noted that while he had voted "aye" to the motion, he believed that passage of such an ordinance may be premature.

The secretary reported that John Misiura has forward us a Single Application for Assistance that he received from State Senator John Wozniak. Mr. Misiura represents a group of citizens who wish to have sewer and water service extended approximately an additional mile up Church Hill Road. After discussion, it was determined that it may be premature to file the application until our primary project is funded by USDA Rural Development. The secretary will discuss this situation with our engineers and if appropriate will file the application.

Payment of Accounts

Tracy Plessinger made a motion to pay bills as listed on treasurer's report and approve same. Fred Soisson seconded the motion. A vote was taken. All three supervisors voted aye. Treasurer's report is attached.
